Make the Most of Your Pharmacy Internship:

Since you have all just participated in the Career Days, the WSPS Professionalism Committee and PLS Professional Affairs Committee thought it would be helpful to summarize a few key items regarding the internship process:

- Get an early start: You've just improved your professional development skills and attended your maybe first ever Career Fair; stay focused and prepared as recruitment is already underway for the coming summer.
- <u>Keep focused goals in mind</u>: Pick opportunities you truly have interest and curiosity in and something you know will be a pivotal stepping stone in your career path.
- <u>Use your resources</u>: Check LinkedIn, Handshake, or organization-specific websites for opportunities. Another great resource when looking for summer internships is people! Remember those pharmacy leaders who you met at previous networking events? Or the recent Career Fair? Reach out to them and ask for their time and insights. They may have certain opportunities in mind and can better guide you directly to applying.
- <u>Follow through and follow up</u>: Following a networking event, a job interview, or the
 Career Fair, be sure to reach out to folks afterward. Express your gratitude and points
 of interest if a topic was particularly impactful or meaningful to you. (Review
 October's Career Newsletter for helpful tips when writing thank you emails and
 notes!)
- Take initiative: Always offer help even when it's not asked of you!
- Manage yourself: Time management and project management skills are crucial. Stay
 on top of your organizational abilities and make sure you're communicating
 effectively. Turn in projects before expected and communicate if you're feeling like
 you need more time.

AMCP P&T Competition

The Pharmacy & Therapeutics (P&T) Competition will be held in late January 2023 and is designed to challenge student pharmacists to gain a real-world perspective of the formulary management process. Competitors will be assigned a drug, and participating students are split into teams of four. Teams will evaluate the economic and clinical impact of a given drug and present a formulary recommendation to a P&T Committee. UW-Madison's winning submission will be sent to AMCP National and will have a chance to compete at the AMCP annual meeting.

By integrating knowledge of pharmacy and pharmaceuticals with theories and concepts from the social and management sciences, medicine, epidemiology, history, and economics, the HSRP PhD at UW–Madison delivers a program rich in both depth and breadth, giving graduates the tools to design and shape the future of health care delivery.
