Any Interview

- 1. Be prepared to answer any question related to anything listed on your resume, curriculum vitae, or the application that was filled out when you applied to the position.
- 2. Be prepared to explain gaps in employment or education.
- 3. Be prepared to answer a question related to global and/or cultural awareness and the U.S.'s role within the context of the world.
- 4. Be prepared to answer questions related to self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, and relationship management.
- 5. What are your strengths/weaknesses related to this position?
- 6. What are your short-term and long-term professional goals?
- 7. Describe your ideal working environment.
- 8. Describe a difficult work experience and what you learned from it.
- 9. Describe a positive work experience and what you learned from it.
- 10. What are ways you deal with stress, challenges, or negative situations at work?
- 11. Describe your ideal supervisor.
- 12. What do you do for fun?
- 13. Why do you believe you would be a good fit for this position?
- 14. Why are you leaving your current position (if you're currently employed elsewhere)?
- 15. Describe a time when you set a goal and achieved it.
- 16. Tell me about a time when you faced an ethical dilemma and how you handled it.
- 17. Please discuss an important written document you were required to complete.
- 18. Tell me about a time when you had to go above and beyond in order to get a job done.
- 19. Give me an example of a time when you had to make a split-second decision.
- 20. What is your typical way of dealing with conflict? Give me an example.
- 21. Tell me about a time you were able to successfully deal with another person even when that individual may not have personally liked you (or vice versa).
- 22. Tell me about a difficult decision you've made in the last year.
- 23. What did you like or dislike about previous positions you've held?
- 24. Give me an example of a time when something you tried to accomplish failed.
- 25. Give me an example of when you showed initiative and took the lead.
- 26. If you belong(ed) to a student or professional organization, describe your role in it.
- 27. Tell me about a recent situation in which you had to deal with a very upset customer/patient or co-worker.
- 28. Give me an example of a time when you motivated others.
- 29. Tell me about a time when you delegated a project or task effectively.
- 30. Give me an example of a time when you used your fact-finding skills to solve a problem.
- 31. Tell me about a time when you missed an obvious solution to a problem.



- 32. Describe a time when you anticipated potential problems and developed preventive measures.
- 33. Tell me about a time when you were forced to make an unpopular decision.
- 34. Describe a time when you set your sights too high (or too low) and how did that turn out?
- 35. Do you prefer to work individually or as part of a team and why?
- 36. Where do you see the future of pharmacy going? Where do you see the pharmacy profession five or ten years down the round?
- 37. Describe a time you demonstrated creativity or innovation.
- 38. Do you have any outside commitments that would prohibit a flexible or rotating schedule?

Jobs in Academia

- 1. Why are you interested in our institution/department? What interests you about this position?
- 2. What are your research and/or teaching interests?
- 3. Describe previous research and/or teaching projects and experiences.
- 4. What is your personal philosophy of teaching/research/service/being a faculty member?
- 5. What gives you the most satisfaction as a professional?
- 6. What are some characteristics of a good faculty member/researcher/teacher that you admire?

Residencies

Reflective Questions

- 1. Why do you want to do a residency? Why are you interviewing for a residency *here* specifically?
- 2. Where do you see yourself after a pharmacy practice residency? What is your ideal position in 5 years if all barriers are removed?
- 3. What areas of pharmacy most interest you?
- 4. What qualities do you possess that would make you a good resident?
- 5. What are your worst qualities?
- 6. Are you considering a specialty residency or fellowship?
- 7. Why did you attend pharmacy school?
- 8. What is your definition of pharmaceutical care?
- 9. What do you think are the greatest barriers to the growth of the pharmacy profession today?
- 10. Describe a situation where you received constructive feedback on your work.
- 11. What is your experience with research? What are your thoughts about completing a research project during your residency?
- 12. What are your expectations of your pharmacy preceptors?
- 13. Describe a time when you were responsible for helping a group of people understand a new way of thinking about problems and opportunities.
- 14. Describe a time when you feel you made a difference in a patient's care.



Experiential Questions

- 1. What was your favorite rotation?
- 2. Describe the most significant contribution you made to a patient's care this past year.
- 3. What was your least favorite rotation?
- 4. Describe your most memorable experience from clerkship rotations.
- 5. If I were to ask preceptor X to describe you, what words would he or she use?
- 6. Describe your favorite or most memorable patient.
- 7. Who was your favorite preceptor?
- 8. Describe or discuss the most interesting medical journal article you have recently read.
- 9. Describe a conflict with a preceptor or attending physician.
- 10. What is your definition of a clinical pharmacist?

Doctor of Pharmacy

- 1. What have you done to prepare for pharmacy school? (experience, education, qualifications)
- 2. What factors influenced your decision to attend pharmacy school? (influences, motivation)
- 3. Why do you want to attend pharmacy school? (motivations and personal awareness)
- 4. Why do you want to be a pharmacist? (intent and purpose)
- 5. Tell me about yourself. (self-awareness, your story related to preparing for pharmacy)
- 6. Describe your related experience. (volunteer, community, clinical, research experience)
- 7. Why will you be a good pharmacy student?
- 8. What will you do if you do not get into pharmacy school? What is your second career choice?
- 9. What challenges do you anticipate arising during pharmacy school? During your career?
- 10. What changes would you like to see made in the current healthcare delivery system?
- 11. What other schools have you applied to? What's your first choice and why?
- 12. Why do you want to go here? (your specific criteria for evaluating pharmacy programs)
- 13. What do you know about this pharmacy school? (provide specific criteria and reasons)
- 14. What criteria are you using to evaluate potential schools?
- 15. What type of pharmacist do you want to be? (career goals, types of practice interested in)
- 16. How did the pharmacists you volunteered/shadowed/worked with influence your outlook on the field of pharmacy?
- 17. Explain the discrepancy between your grades and PCAT scores. (qualifications)
- 18. How has your undergraduate education prepared you for pharmacy school?
- 19. Tell me about a time you believe you made a difference with a patient, or describe your most effective interaction with a patient in a hospital setting?
- 20. What do you see as the most critical issues in pharmacy today?
- 21. What is your opinion on ______? (a current issue in pharmacy and healthcare so try to stay up-to-date on current events)
